Applicant Reference	The Panel considered information pack 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-730018 plus 4 videos.
Relevant Tideway site	Acton Storm Tanks
Decision	DEFERRED
Details of the award	The claimant's case was reviewed by the ICP on August 25 th 2020 when she was claiming for overnight respite for her husband, rehousing and for all noisy work to start after 13:30 hrs. In one of her emails, she mentions she has been troubled by site noise for two years. It was difficult to understand how noise affected their property so a decision was deferred until a visit could be made. Several emails were received complaining of the noise and she also complained of bright lights shining into their flat.
	Videos have been provided by the claimant in respect of construction activity occurring both day and night. These appear to have been taken from a balcony or through an open window, such that the noise does not necessarily reflect the situation within the property with windows closed.
	The Panel is fully aware of the noise complaints registered for the area and has taken the general pattern of complaints fully into account.



	The Chair of the ICP visited the area on the 6 th November 2020 and noted that, at that time, there were no obvious noisy activities occurring on the Tideway site such as to result in significant disturbance. There were, however, very noisy utilities activities occurring in the street which involved the use of pneumatic breakers.
	The Panel has determined that it requires both the most up to date s.61 for the site and recent noise monitoring data. Additionally, subject to Government guidance, a site visit to the property would assist the Panel in finalising this claim subject to the claimant being willing to facilitate that visit.

Decision	NOT AWARDED
Details of the award	The Panel is fully aware of the claimant's medical conditions. The request from the claimant is for the reinstatement of her previous respite.
	The claimant had previously requested that her respite award should be altered to allow for meals to be delivered to her home. That request was turned down at that time as it would not provide the necessary respite away from the site.
	Also, as previously indicated, "The Panel noted that the final works on the slurry treatment plant (STP) construction are effectively complete and that all significant operations will be undertaken within acoustic enclosures and the noise impact on the resident will be further reduced".
	The Panel is fully aware of the noise complaints registered for the area and has taken the general pattern of complaints fully into account.
	The ICP is aware that grouting works have been ongoing on the eastern side of the acoustic shed and also that the tunnel boring machine (TBM) has been delivered and, from the latest s.61, tunnelling is due to commence December/January 2020. Final works to the STP and muck bin areas are ongoing and there have also been works to a water main.



	The latest noise monitoring report includes the monthly period up to the 5 th October 2020 and indicates no TAP or s.61 exceedances and that noise levels, day and night, are generally low.
	The Panel also reviewed the raw noise monitoring data for October 2020. The data for NM_10, which is the closest noise monitor to the claimant's property, indicates a continuation of the low levels of noise reported in the previous formal noise monitoring report.
	The Panel determined that, as noise levels remain relatively low, an award is not made.
	The ICP will be considering measured noise levels and the s.61 consents covering the tunnelling works as they commence in order to determine at that time whether there is any significant change to the noise climate in the area.

Applicant Reference	The Panel considered information pack 2350-TDWAY-TTTUN-990-ZZ-ZZ-729988 .
Relevant Tideway site	Chambers Wharf
Decision	DEFERRED
Details of the award	The property is located across the River Thames from the site. They are requesting the reinstatement of temporary overnight accommodation close to their current property where they are working from home.
	They have stated that they continue to be disturbed by low frequency noise although the most recent noise monitoring and report did not establish that low frequency noise was emanating from the Chambers Wharf site.
	The claimant has provided a number of noise readings using a phone App which appear to identify low frequency noise.
	The Chair and the Noise & Vibration Specialist attended a video meeting with CVB and their noise specialist in order to determine a way forward in respect of this claim. It was agreed that further noise monitoring was required within the claimant's property. A full NANR 45 investigation should be carried out and CVB's noise specialist would develop a measurement methodology for submission to and review by the ICP including a full interview. Noise measurements should be attempted before tunnelling starts so that fans can be shut off/turned on to establish the differences in noise levels.



	Post meeting note: Communication with the claimant and his partner has been arranged for 16 th November 2020.

Details of the award	The Panel had previously deferred a decision in respect of a request from the claimant for three weeks emergency daily respite. A representative of the claimant on this submission to the ICP,
	reported drilling noise from grouting on the eastern side of the site which has currently paused but may soon start up again. Her health issues are known to the Panel and have been fully taken into account.
	The Panel has now received, as requested, the raw noise monitoring data for the period which included the recent grouting and drilling works that occurred on the eastern side of the acoustic enclosure and notes the elevated levels of noise recorded, at times, particularly on the 13 th , 14 th , 15 th , 16 th and 19 th of October 2020.
	The Panel determined to make an award of a total of five days of daily respite for the claimant and a carer.
	It should be noted that all awards are subject to Government guidance current at the time of making the award.

Details of the award	The Panel had previously deferred a decision in respect of a request from the claimant for three weeks emergency daily respite'.
	The Panel has now received, as requested, the raw noise monitoring data for the period which included the recent grouting and drilling works that occurred on the eastern side of the acoustic enclosure and notes the elevated levels of noise recorded, at times, particularly on the 13 th , 14 th , 15 th , 16 th and 19 th of October 2020.
	The claimant's health problems are known to the Panel and have been taken fully into account and the complaints register for the area has also been reviewed.
	The Panel notes that the rooms which the claimant has identified as using within the property are facing away from the current external works area. Accordingly, the Panel does not consider that noise from the recent grouting and drilling works would be at such a level as to cause significant health effects to the claimant and hence no award is made.
