Panel members had also recently visited the general area around the construction site to gauge the extent to which it is impacting on nearby residents.
	The Panel awards the sum claimed for the loss of rental income due to Tideway works for the period from 1 September 2019 to 31 January 2021, which is understood to be the date that the tenants vacated the flat before the expiry of the tenancy.
	With respect to the request for blackout blinds the claimant is directed towards. Tideway's blackout blinds procedure which involves the assessment of the extent to which light trespass occurs at the property.



	The Panel is unable to comment on any effect on the capital value of the flat from Tideway's permanent works.

	The claimant is requesting financial compensation for disturbance related to the water main replacement which affects their working at home.
Details of the award	Members of the Panel carried out an unannounced site visit on the 3 rd February 2021 to determine the extent to which noise from the site would result in disturbance to occupiers of property in the immediate vicinity of the site. The visit confirmed that, at that time, noise levels in the area were relatively low. The water main works were paused at the time of the site visit, although the Panel understands that noisy work will recommence and that work, whilst of relatively short duration, would be completed by the end of March 2021.



	The claimant requested financial compensation; however, the claim is not considered to warrant an exceptional circumstances award and therefore no financial award is made.

Details of the award	The claimant is currently working from home and reports that she is suffering greatly from the disturbance caused by the water main works and is asking to be relocated for the duration of the water main replacement works.
	Members of the Panel carried out an unannounced site visit on the 3 rd February 2021 to determine the extent to which noise from the site would result in disturbance to occupiers of property in the immediate vicinity of the site. The visit confirmed that, at that time, noise levels in the area were relatively low. The water main works were paused at the time of the site visit, although the Panel understands that noisy work will recommence and that work whilst of relatively short duration would be completed by the end of March 2021.
	The Panel considered very carefully the case put by the claimant and, as a very precautionary measure makes an award of access to a serviced apartment on an as required basis. Additionally, an offer of a pair of noise cancelling headphones to a maximum cost of £100 is made.

Details of the award	The claimant was relocated at their request due to the impact that the Thames Tideway works at Chambers Wharf was having. The claimant is now stating that the size of the flat is insufficient for their work activities. The request for alternative accommodation was previously turned down by Tideway and the claimant is now appealing against that decision and this has been brought to the ICP for further consideration. As far as the Panel is aware, at the time of their award of accommodation away from Chambers Wharf, the claimant did not make a case for the provision of any space to carry out their business.
	Following due consideration, and on the basis that the claimant has been offered appropriate alternative accommodation and in respect of the above considerations, the Panel rejects this appeal.
