Details of the award	The claimant complains of unbearable noise from the site starting early in the morning until late at night. She and her children are reporting sleep disturbance. There is no detail on her health issues.
	Detailed reviews of current site activity at CHAWF have previously been provided but the current issues are mainly associated with the noise from flints travelling through the slurry pipe overbridge and hitting the sides and bends in the pipe.
	The Panel has previously carried out a detailed visit to the construction site on the 16 th of July 2021 and has also reviewed videos provided by a number of claimants which has provided context for all claims received from the Chambers Wharf area. The Panel noted that the slurry pipe bridge which has apparently been causing a degree of disturbance is now being acoustically clad in order to reduce noise from that particular structure, although the works are not now anticipated to be completed until the end of August 2021.
	The Panel has determined to make an offer of an award of 2 days respite/week for the claimant and her children until the end of August 2021. This award may be commuted to a seven day holiday break at an equivalent cost to be taken before the end of August 2021.

Details of the award	The claimant previously claimed that disturbance from the site was affecting her and exacerbating her existing health issues which are well known to the Panel. The claimant would like previously awarded respite to continue through to September when the children go back to school. She has provided details in respect of her medications.



	Detailed reviews of current site activity at CHAWF have previously been provided but the current issues are mainly associated with the noise from flints travelling through the slurry pipe overbridge and hitting the sides and bends in the pipe.
	The Panel had previously carried out a detailed visit to the construction site on the 16 th of July 2021 and has also reviewed videos provided by a number of claimants which has provided context for all claims received from the Chambers Wharf area. Decision	AWARDED
Details of the award	The claimant is requesting an air conditioning unit to allow her to have windows closed whilst working from home. She is working at home and is likely to continue doing so in the future.
	From previous assessments, residents were informed by e-mail note that Tideway will be conducting some noisy activities in May, June and July 2021 as the site is dismantled and that these works may cause significant disturbance to the residents.
	Previous photographs from other residents show that work was ongoing in the MEICA works area although these are not the works that have been described as possibly resulting in significant disturbance. However, the Panel is aware from residents that the works in the MEICA area have been disturbing.
	The Panel considered the evidence available to it including information in the current s61 and has determined to make an

	award of a fan or air conditioning unit to a maximum cost of £300.

Relevant Tideway site	Hammersmith Pumping Station
Decision	AWARDED
Details of the award	The claimant is reporting that vibration and noise from the site are leaving her unable to work properly and is affecting her mental and physical health and this often leads to her feeling nauseous.
	Her PA works with her at home 2-3 days per week and the noise is so loud that they are unable to do that currently. The Panel reviewed a video which identified a high level of noise and vibration.
	From previous assessments, residents have been informed by e-mail note that Tideway will be conducting some noisy activities in May, June and July 2021 as the site is dismantled and that these works may cause significant disturbance to the residents.
	The Panel makes an award of access to an appropriate office space for a period of one month for the claimant and her PA after which time it is not anticipated that there will be significant levels of noise or vibration from the site.

	Detailed reviews of current site activity at CHAWF have previously been provided but the current issues are mainly associated with the noise from flints travelling through the slurry pipe overbridge and hitting the sides and bends in the pipe. The Panel carried out a detailed site visit to the construction site on the 16 th of July 2021 and has also reviewed videos provided by a number of claimants which has provided context for all claims received from the Chambers Wharf area. The Panel noted that the slurry pipe bridge which has apparently been causing a degree of disturbance is now being acoustically clad in order to reduce noise from that particular structure, although the works are not now anticipated to be completed until the end of August 2021.
Details of the award	The Panel determined that as the Air Quality Reports for the site identify levels of particulates which are significantly below the National Air Quality Objectives an award of an air purifier would not be made.
	Recognising the health issues of the claimant's son, the Panel makes an award of fans or an air conditioning unit to a total cost of £300 plus £55 for electricity costs.
	The Panel has determined to make an offer of an award of 2 days respite/week for the claimant and her children until the end of August 2021. This award may be commuted to a seven day holiday break at an equivalent cost to be taken before the end of August 2021.

Details of the award	The Panel had previously made an award of two days respite a week/person until the end of September 2021. The award was broadly in line with similar awards and the claimants, when visited in their property, had not expressed any specific requirements other than that they were seeking respite. The claimant having reviewed the guidelines has now expressed a desire for a different form of respite which the Panel has fully considered.



	Based on the home visit the Panel made, the claimant's health issues and the Panel's knowledge of the present site activities, the Panel has determined to make an award of a one week respite holiday for the claimant and his partner.

The Panel noted that the slurry pipe bridge which has apparently been causing a degree of disturbance is now being acoustically clad in order to reduce noise from that particular structure, although the works are not now anticipated to be completed until the end of August 2021.
	The Panel has determined that they would take up the offer of a home visit and request that Tideway organise this for September.
