3.0	Updates from project team including - Construction update and future programme - Noise and air quality - Mitigation - Community Investment and Community Relations					
3.1	Construction Update					
	LR provided an update on the latest construction progress (see presentation here - <u>link</u>).					
	 Main Tunnel (Chambers Wharf to Abbey Mills) Main tunnel drive has been completed and Tunnel Boring Machine Selina has safely arrived at Abbey Mills shaft. 5.5km of tunnel constructed with 700,000t of material mined and removed from site by barge. Tunnelling started June 2021 and completed in April 2022. The team worked 24/7 only stopping for 12 days at Christmas. 					
	 Greenwich Connection Tunnel (Greenwich to Chambers Wharf) Greenwich TBM (Annie) safely arrived at Chambers Wharf shaft in April 2022, completing 4.5km of tunnel The TBM is currently being dismantled with components lifted to the surface and loaded on to barges. 					
	 Tunnelling equipment removal 600th crane has been used to remove large pieces of equipment 11km of slurry pipework removed. Tunnelling locomotives and rolling stock have been removed. Grout plant has been removed from the acoustic building. 					
	 Slurry Treatment Plant removal ongoing Slurry Treatment Plant has been decommissioned and cleaned ready for dismantling. Silos have been emptied and removed. Pipe bridge has been dismantled and removed from site. Concrete L-blocks have been removed around muck storage area. 					
	Upcoming works (until the end of 2022)					
	Slurry Treatment Plant removal works are ongoing until October. This will include removal of:

De-sanding building (September – October)

The Water Treatment Plant will remain for the secondary lining work.

Upcoming work continued

- Greenwich Tunnel Boring Machine and associated tunnelling support gantry sections will be removed.
- Main tunnel secondary lining shutters will be delivered to site by barge and launched in the tunnel.
- Greenwich tunnel secondary lining work. Secondary lining is where we add an additional layer of concrete onto the inside of the tunnel.
- Chambers Wharf civil works and set up for piling works associated with the new river wall will be in January 2023. Civil work includes work like piling, concrete and surface works.

LR presented the timetable for the remaining period of construction, summarised in the table below:

LR explained that commissioning is a general term, which relates to the testing regime of the sewer.

Question

How much of the material and equipment is reused?

Response

It varies on the type and condition of the equipment or material once we have finished with it.

E.g. there is a community reuse scheme for timber that has been used on site E.g. tunnel excavated material has been moved to Rainham Marshes to help landscape the salt marshes

E.g. some pipe work can be reused, but others have been worn out by the construction process

New Action 1 – Team to present at future CLWG on the reused and recycled elements of the project.

3.2 Noise and air quality monitoring

MGa noted that there have been zero noise exceedances in the last 6 months and zero air quality exceedances in the last 12 months.

If there were to be any exceedances these would be shown by our monitors and are investigated thoroughly after we have been alerted. The local authority will also be informed.

Some recent environmental successes on site include the use of:

- Hydrotreated vegetable oil (HVO) fuel to run site plant and machinery
- An anti-idling campaign to limit air quality impacts

Section 61 update

- The current Section 61 Phase 7 has been in place since March 2022 and covers work up until December 2022.
- Works have been and will continue to happen inside the acoustic shed for the next couple of months.
- Majority of works that occur outside of standard working hours are taking place within the acoustic enclosure.

Question - Asked by PB on behalf of a resident that could not attend the meeting - can anything be done about noise and the main vehicle gate especially in the morning – the gate is banging shut and operatives are talking loudly?

Response – CVB team to address concerns with site team.

Post meeting note: foam has been added to the gate to lessen the noise and the site team have re-briefed about keeping noise levels down.

The resident has also been sent a response to his query.

3.4 **Community relations**

MG provided a summary of some of the community relations initiatives that have been undertaken recently including:

 Work experience and STEM (careers in science, technology, engineering and maths) - MP Jesse Norman visited Chambers Wharf last week and dropped in on a work experience session

- Staff have volunteered at the London Design & Engineering University Technical College for the visit of the Minister of Skills and Apprenticeships, Alex Burghart MP and Chairman of the Baker Dearing Trust, Lord Baker
- Volunteering and charity work e.g. marathon runners, charitable bike rides, sponsored rowing
- Volunteering support for the Ahoy Centre, London Youth Rowing, Thames21

4.0 Feedback and Discussion

Question - Asked by PB on behalf of a resident that could not attend the meeting - regarding traffic and signage at Llewellyn Street; the resident noted traffic had travelled in the wrong direction on the street. Could more signage be put up?

Response.

The team work closely with our supply chain to ensure vehicles are using the correct delivery routes, this includes sending driver introduction packs to drivers with the specified routes and the delivery times that need to be avoided due to school entry and exit timings.

New Action 3 – Team to look at complaint and respond to resident regarding Llewellyn Street

Post meeting note: After confirming with Southwark Council there are no plans for additional signage on Llewellyn Street as there are a lot of signs in the area.

The resident has been sent a response to his query. No further complaints have been received regarding vehicles on Llewellyn Street.

5.0 **Southwark Council Community Enhancement Fund and Section 106** updates

JC provided an update on Southwark Council's work in the area

George Row Playground

- Approx £600.000 has been provided under the Tideway S106 for the improvements to local play spaces. A big proportion of this (£400,000) is allocated for the George Row area.
- Work has started to redevelop the George Row playground.
- The improvements are part of the Council's work in partnership with local residents and Tideway who are funding this project to mitigate their construction impact.
- Several rounds of consultation with local residents and ward councillors and have produced the final design.

Cherry Garden and Thames Path improvements

- Approx £300,000 has been provided under the Tideway Section106 for the improvements to the Thames Path.
- The Thames Path work is well underway and is due to be completed soon.

- The new mosaic design designed by local people is the last piece of work that needs to be completed.
- There will be an opening event when the improvements are complete which will be advertised by London Borough of Southwark when the date is finalised.

Community Enhancement Fund

The below projects received funding in April 2022:

- The Salmon Youth Centre
- Pollinator Friendly Rain Garden
- Wilson Grove hedging

In May 2022 Southwark Council and Tideway hosted a second walkabout to promote the Community Enhancement Fund. The notes of this walkabout will be available on the Tideway website and circulated with the notes of this CLWG meeting.

Question

A resident asked if funding had been allocated to Fountain Green Square?

Response

No specific Section106 funding has been allocated for Fountain Green Square, but residents can apply under the Community Enhancement Fund for community enhancement proposals.

JC from Southwark Council noted that residents that attended the last walkabout were interested in putting in an application to the Community Enhancement Fund Panel.

JC has not received an application from residents, but JC is looking at ways to support residents to put an application in.

5.0 Any other business

PB wanted to formally record our sadness and condolences at hearing of the passing of a resident, Adrian, that had attended and contributed to these meetings in the past. PB recognised Adrian for his important contributions and very valued input to these meetings.

PB closed the meeting by thanking residents, as well officers, for attending.
