## THIS WEEK

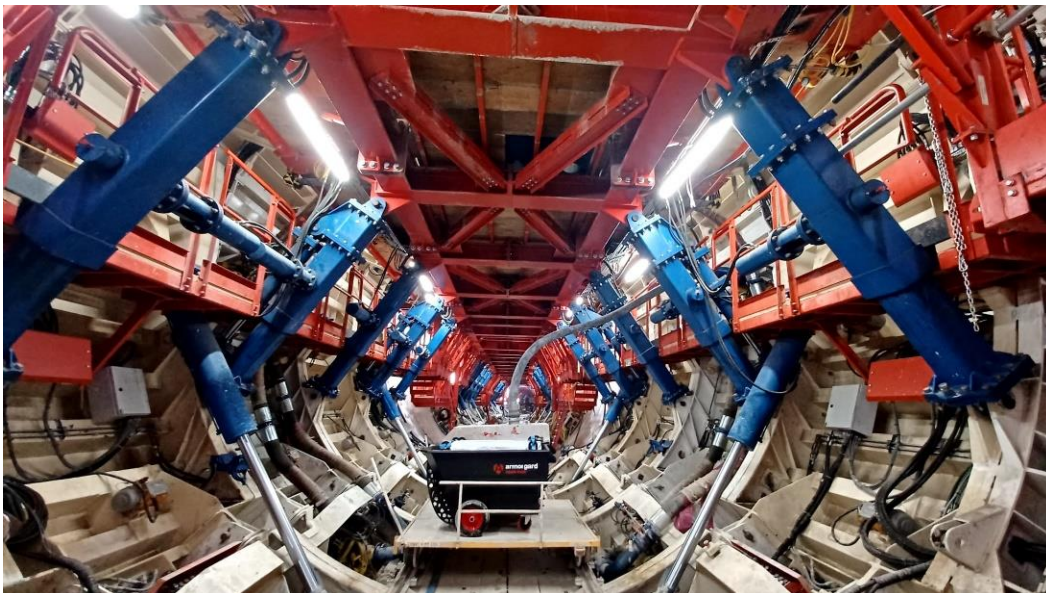
The team has been continuing with piling work in the west of the site. We have completed installing the guide wall, which is needed to construct the vertical piles that will form part of the new permanent river wall.

The team also continued adding a secondary concrete lining to the new tunnel, which also means moving aggregate and other logistics at surface level within the site.

We continued floor sawing, concrete breaking and excavation works in the east of the site for the Air Treatment Unit (ATU), where we also have archaeologists surveying within the ground.

Demolition began on the de-sanding building concrete wall, including some concrete breaking. This building, located in the centre of the site, was needed during the tunnelling phase.

There is limited concrete breaking planned tomorrow (Saturday 11 March) from 9am until 1pm. It is happening on a Saturday as the site access route needs to be closed to enable the team to safely demolish part of the de-sanding building structure. We will limit the amount of concrete breaking to a minimum, where possible. There will also be general site maintenance, movement of aggregates for secondary lining activities, plus continued tie-in and ATU excavation.

## NEXT WEEK

We will continue piling on the west side of the site and concrete breaking of the de-sanding building's walls, then removing that material from the site.

Concrete breaking will be limited during the day, as much as possible.

We will continue the ATU and river wall tie-in excavation on the east side, with periodic concrete breaking and excavation. Archaeologists will be working alongside us during these excavations and documenting any interesting finds or objects of historical note. Secondary lining works of the tunnel will continue, with associated movement of aggregate and logistics. Excavated material will be removed by barge and we will be starting up to three new boreholes within the cofferdam footprint.

The team will endeavour to complete any concrete breaking work between the hours of 9am and 5pm. We will continue to use noise barriers around any breaking work, use tools and equipment designed to reduce impacts, plus continue to monitor noise and vibration.

## WORKING HOURS

As a reminder, we are working 24 hours per day within the acoustic enclosure. The doors of the enclosure are closed for the night from 6pm to 8am, although there may be occasions when they are re-opened in the evening (up to 10pm) for the movement of equipment, or for a limited time through the night (under exceptional circumstances).

This table outlines working hours for the movement of materials onsite, outside the noise enclosure.

## OTHER NEWS - Section 106 & Community Enhancement Fund Update

The Tideway project's Section 106 agreement with Southwark Council includes £1 million specifically allocated for a Community Enhancement Fund to be spent in the Chambers Wharf area, on projects promoted by the local community.

To date, there is still approximately £550,000 of the Community Enhancement Fund left to be allocated for local projects. The latest round of applications closed at the end of February. Eight applications have been received and the panel of community representatives will be voting on the current applications soon.
