


PROJECT OVERVIEW



- Primary tunnelling is now complete
- Tunnel secondary lining is due to complete in 2023
- All shafts are fully excavated, shafts are being secondary lined with concrete and shaft lids are going on
- System testing and commissioning to start winter 2023/24
- Super sewer on track to be operational in 2025
- Overall project is over 85% complete



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

July 2022 to February 2023



Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO)

- Horizontal propping installed in 12m deep excavation (South)
- Existing sewer demolished
- Excavation, grouting & support props continuing (North)
- Concrete works started (South)






COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW



- We are finishing excavation plus installing the last level of support props within the excavated chamber.
- We will extend from April onward concrete works to the whole CSO.






SHAFT WORKS



- Adding a secondary lining of concrete within the tunnel between Greenwich and Bermondsey continues and will soon reach the bottom of the Earl shaft.
- Once tunnel secondary lining is complete, tentatively by May, we will resume construction of all the internal structures at the bottom of the shaft (including concrete connection with tunnels).



NOISE MITIGATION



Key methods for reducing noise onsite:

- Planning construction methods with noise impacts as a key consideration (Section 61 consent)
- Monitoring noise across site to identify exceptional noise sources
- Acoustic screening for static machinery, where possible
- Localised screening of louder activities (concrete breaking, floor sawing etc.) where possible
- Sourcing / developing low noise plant & equipment, where possible
- Shutting down plant and equipment when not in use
- Off site fabrication of construction elements, where possible
- Using mains electricity to power equipment, where practicable
- Alternative concrete cutting techniques used to reduce noise when breaking concrete



ODOUR MANAGEMENT



While the team is excavating, odour from ground conditions may become more noticeable.

To minimise this:

- Odorous excavated material is covered and removed from the site as soon as possible
- Site personnel are trained to identify and deal effectively with odour sources
- We also have a misting system, to de-odourise or mask odour when necessary
- Focused boundary monitoring for odorous materials of primary concern





TREE PRUNING



- Seasonal pruning of trees is required on Croft Street ahead of the new growth season
- Pruning is necessary to ensure access to our CSO works area for cranes and for our security camera sightlines
- Assessments undertaken by an arboriculturist ensures minimal impact on tree health
- Only new growth will be pruned



LEGACY: VOLUNTEERING








Staff across Tideway East sites dropped gifts into donation boxes in the run up to Christmas.




ARCHITECTURE AND LANDSCAPE WORKS




- The architecture and landscape formal submission to Lewisham Council was made on 3 January 2023

- Lewisham Council will decide on this application by the end of February






Earl PS – J726.01 HV Switchgear and Transformer Replacement - Brief Scope of Works - Mechanical
