KING EDWARD MEMORIAL PARK FORESHORE - WORKS UPDATE

In June, we are planning to start removing the cofferdam, the temporary area of land that we built out into the river so that we could construct the structures needed for the new super sewer. Once we have removed the cofferdam, the shape of the new riverside public space and new river wall will become visible.

How long will it take?

Removal of the cofferdam will take around a year to complete. It will be a gradual process which will vary in intensity, depending upon the construction activity required. We will start at the eastern end, closer to Free Trade Wharf.

What will you be doing?

To remove the cofferdam, we need to break out some of the concrete, plus excavate and remove the sheet piles from the riverbed. We will start by using a Giken pile driver, to remove the piles. Should we be unable to extract piles using this less intrusive method, a Vibro pile driver will be required.

Excavated material, as well as the sheet piles, will leave the site by barge. Site machinery will continue to arrive by road.

Concrete and Interception Chamber works will also be under way during cofferdam removal, from June until April 2024. This involves reinforced concrete in a tidally affected area.

When will you be working?

We will be working within standard site working hours:

- Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm
- Saturdays from 8am to 1pm
- With council dispensation to work from 5am to 8am and 6pm to 10pm for tidally affected works, including using plant, if necessary for barge operations

How will you minimise disruption?

Where possible, we will use the less intrusive pile removal equipment. We will also use appropriate noise mitigation, such as noise blankets. We will continue to monitor noise levels to ensure we stay within limits approved by the local authority.

Independent Compensation Panel (ICP)

Some people are affected more than others by construction work such as noise and vibration.
