

DEPTFORD CHURCH STREET SITE UPDATE

Construction at Tideway's Deptford Church Street site is progressing well, with all main work expected to be completed in Spring 2024. Following that, we will start testing the new sewer system and begin landscaping works to transform the current worksite into a new and improved public space, before London's new super sewer becomes fully operational in 2025.

Ahead of the next Community Liaison Working Group meeting on Monday, here is an update on progress, with details about some essential overnight works associated with the shaft.

Shaft

We are continuing construction of internal concrete structures within the shaft. This includes overnight work within the shaft for leak sealing of the secondary lining. Once completed, the site focus will return to the surface, where we will soon start construction of a shaft cover slab. This will require a large, specialist, mobile crane to lift 100 tonne roof beams into position. This crane will arrive in sections before being assembled onsite. Due to the size of some of these, they will be delivered before 6:00 am when the roads are typically quieter, starting in the week of 20 November. We apologise for any disruption this may cause.

Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO)

The first phase of the CSO interception works is nearing completion and we anticipate removing some of the temporary flow structures in November. In the new year, works will continue on the remaining walls and a concrete roof slab, which will complete the permanent structure.

Surface works

The Air Treatment Chamber has been completed and we have begun installing equipment inside. The structure of the permanent electrical & control kiosk is also complete, with similar internal works to follow. Finally, installation of underground utility services is under way, in order to connect the new structures.

We will continue to use noise mitigation measures such as acoustic barriers around any breaking work and use tools and equipment designed to reduce impacts. We will also continue to monitor any noise and vibration to ensure we stay within levels agreed with the local authority.
