









Inlet Channel Works

Inlet Channel Works










Above-ground structures

- All above ground structures are now installed, inc. doors and brown roofs
- All structures were designed to match the existing structures aesthetically





Electrical equipment

- Installation of cables and containment was completed in summer 2023
- Installation of the electrical control panels in kiosk & existing pumping station was also completed in summer 2023
- Testing and Commissioning works are ongoing, due to be completed by Feb 2024





Surface & Landscaping works

- The covers installation completed in spring 2023
- All tarmac and concrete surfacing has been installed
- Snagging works are ongoing, including replacing the surface course where the hydraulic oil leak was.

Community Engagement Highlights

Thames River Watch

Thames River Watch, run by environmental charity Thames21, is a 'citizen science' project that involves community volunteers from across London helping to improve the public's understanding of the health of the Thames and the challenges it faces. Funded by Tideway since 2014 and by Tideway and Thames Water from July 2021 to June 2024, the programme has engaged communities up and down the river who have collected and counted thousands of single use plastic bottles and wet wipes.

Bishop Creighton House

This community centre provides a meeting place and services for the community and Tideway volunteers from our Hammersmith site renovated the centre's garden, which had fallen into disrepair. The team spent several weeks cutting back weeds and vegetation as well as repainting fence panels, jet washing the paving, repainting the brickwork and repotting plants. Joy Wilson from BCH said: "We are all very much enjoying the improvement to our garden and have benefitted hugely from the partnership with Tideway. "Tideway's support for the 2022-2023 Our Space fund gave the centre's Gardening Club in Hammersmith, funding to teach people with learning disabilities how to grow nutritious ingredients to support independent living and in 2023 Tideway gave BCH a community energy grant to help with rising energy costs.



Public artwork officially unveiled

The first permanent public artwork on the project was officially unveiled in September and is now proudly on display at Hammersmith Pumping Station.

Under the theme of 'Recreation to Industry: Society in Transition', artist <u>Sarah Staton</u> has created a bespoke bronze plaque which contains a quote from Queen Caroline of Brunswick – the controversial wife of George IV who, with ties to the Reform Movement, was instrumental in calling for democratic reform and rights for universal suffrage. Hammersmith Pumping Station occupies part of the former riverside estate of Brandenburg House, where Queen Caroline died in 1821.



Local stakeholders and members of the Tideway and BMB teams were in attendance at an intimate ceremony to witness Andy Slaughter MP, Member of Parliament for Hammersmith, unveil the plaque alongside the artist.

The event was also an opportunity to celebrate the Hammersmith Pumping Station team working toward completion of substantive works at the site.

What happens next

Although construction is mostly complete, you may continue to see some Tideway staff working as we work to bring the super sewer into operation. There will also be occasional periods when we need to close part or all the area while we undertake testing work for the sewer.

Hammersmith Pumping Station will remain operational as a Thames Water Pumping Station, but in a reduced capacity as majority of the storm overflows will be diverted into the new sewer instead of being pumped into the river.
