Tideway Tunnel Overview



25 kilometres long

Travelling from west to east London, the main tunnel will be 25km long. Two connection tunnels will be 4.6km and 1.1km long.



metres wide

The main tunnel will have an internal diameter of 6.5 metres between Acton Storm Tanks and Carnwath Road Riverside. It will have a 7.2 metre internal diameter at Abbey Mills Pumping Station. The Greenwich connection tunnel will have a 5 metre internal diameter and Frogmore connection tunnel will be 2.6 metres.

66 metres deep


The tunnel needs to fall one metre every 790 metres so it can be self-cleaning. Starting from 30 metres deep at Acton Storm Tanks, it will finish 66 metres deep at Abbey Mills Pumping Station.

Progress highlights

- Out of tunnels and shafts in the west and almost out of tunnels and shafts in the central section
- Architecture and landscape is well underway at most of our West and Central sites
- Carnwath Road shaft lid has been completed
- Cofferdam removal is complete at Victoria the picture to the right shows the final piles that have now been removed
- Cofferdam removal is progressing at Chelsea, Albert, King Edward Memorial Park. Blackfriars to recommence this month.
- Acoustic shed removal underway at Greenwich and started at Chambers Wharf last week





KRTST- Architecture and Landscaping Phase

- Footpath renovation works at Kirtling St and Cringle St almost complete
- Kirtling St road reinstatement -Completion scheduled for March 2024.
- Kirtling St will be partially open to allow permitted access to areas 1 and 2. The rest of the road will remain closed.
- Outstanding items: lamp posts, bus stop signal and minor snagging on footpaths.



Heathwall Shaft & Tunnels Progress

- 3D scans of Chambers and Shafts
- All snags addressed inside chambers and shafts
- Completion of Scour Protection Phases I and II
- Testing of hydraulic systems
- Minor Civils including paving slabs, drainage, electrical and water supply, parapets, gate foundations etc is ongoing
- A&L Subcontractor paving nearing completion. Brick wall, fence and gate installation is ongoing
- Marine furniture installation ongoing

How we are managing the sites

- EU emissions stage V and IV plant
- Implementing a Circular Economy approach selling and reusing equipment, materials and products.
- Biofuel (Hydro-treated Vegetable Oil) used at Heathwall Pumping Station site, reducing around 85% of CO2e emissions
- Reduction in plant presence
- Diversion of waste from landfill
- Metal recycled on site, reducing product delivery and waste disposal vehicles




Rightway Award

- In September 2023, FLO team won Rightway

- The award recognised our efforts towards Circular Economy and Waste Minimisation
- Thousands of tonnes of materials and equipment have been saved from waste disposal through donation, reuse on other projects, and reselling.



Kirtling Street Noise Monitoring




Heathwall Pumping Station Air Quality






Community Engagement
