New entranceway open at King George's Park

Tideway is pleased to let you know that the new entranceway at King George's Park is now open. This is the north-eastern park entrance at the corner of Buckhold Road and Neville Gill Close. The picture (right) shows local residents accessing the park again over the weekend.

The newly-opened section includes the park name inlaid in bronze to welcome visitors, a range of tree species from Liquidambar to Flowering Cherry and more than 5,000 newly-planted bulbs. The memorial bench that was removed during our construction work has also been reinstated. The area will now be managed and maintained by Enable who look after the rest of the park.

Works will continue on finishing the paving in the adjacent egg-shaped area, this will involve intermittent cutting of block pavers during installation. Once completed and opened up in 2025, it will include



new seating, a bronze artwork by artist Yemi Awosile and poetry by Dorothea Smartt. It will remain behind the fencing as we undertake testing of the new sewer system.

London's new super sewer

Recently, our 25km super sewer has been successfully connected to the existing sewage network in London.

In the coming weeks and months, the entire system will be carefully brought online with individual combined sewage overflow points being connected to the new tunnel, to prevent them from polluting the River Thames.

This commissioning and testing phase will take place over a number of months, with the project expected to be fully operational in 2025.
